For three years, all she had was a Big Book and a willing cellmate. Then one day, when the pandemic ended, she heard a call for meetings.

I arrived in prison in August 2020. I spent my first few weeks in an intake unit waiting to find out what my security and housing unit was. For 22 hours a day, I was locked in my cell with nothing but a tiny pencil, scrap paper and two books from a unit shelf with a poor selection.

I found a Bible that wasn't in bad shape, but the rest of the books were outdated, ripped to hell and uninteresting. On the very bottom shelf between an accounting textbook and a plant manual, I saw a big, blue book. I'd seen an AA book before, so I knew what it was and snatched it up figuring it had to be better than accounting. Back in my cell, I settled in and opened the book to page one. Before I knew it, four hours had gone by and it was time for night chow.

As I was eating my dinner, my cellmate looked up and asked if I had seen another AA book on the shelf. I told her I hadn't. She told me she was here for her sixth DUI and had been attending AA meetings while waiting for her sentencing. She said she liked meetings and they really helped her. I said I'd never been to AA before, but if she wanted to, we could pass the book back and forth and read out loud to each other so she could pretend she was at a meeting.

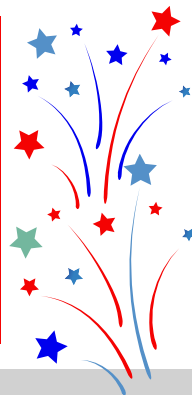
Each night, we would read the stories in the back of the book and talk about how we felt and how we could relate to some of them. I had kind of thought I had a drinking problem before I got to prison, but after hearing

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so many familiar things from the book and talking with her, I no longer had any doubts.

I took a look at the prison's programs list, which we had gotten at orientation, and found that we did, in fact, have AA meetings right there in the prison! My cellmate and I both "kited" the programs and waited and waited. And waited. Nine weeks after I had been assigned to my housing unit, I received a kite which said that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, AA meetings were suspended until further notice and I would be added to the waiting list.

So I kept reading my Big Book. Every time I got to the

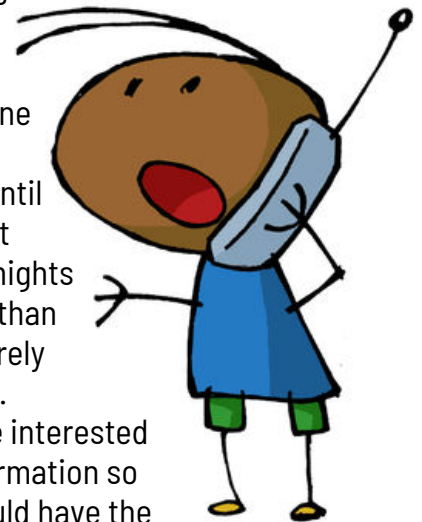
Most callers are interested in meeting information so volunteers should have the internet at hand to access the meeting guide. One year of sobriety is required.

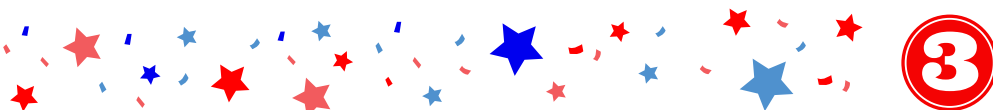

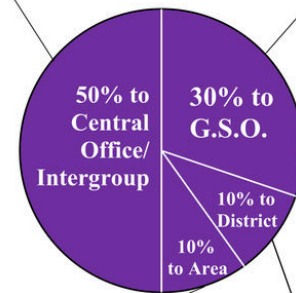

end, I'd go back to the beginning and start again. In late 2022, a notice was finally sent out saying AA groups in our unit were going to start up again and people would be added according to the waitlist.

So I kept reading and waiting, reading and waiting. June of 2023, I woke up to a callout saying I had an AA meeting that evening. I was excited all day long. When the time came to leave, I grabbed my well-worn Big Book and off to the meeting I went.

I felt a little nervous walking in. I chose a chair off to the side and picked up a little card that was on my seat. It said, "Thankful." I was instructed that we would go around the room sharing and talking about what the word on our card meant to us. I thought it over and I knew exactly what to say. When my turn came, I said, "Hi, my name is Melissa and I'm an alcoholic and my word is thankful. I'm thankful that I found this little blue book on my first day of prison, and for three years it inspired me and kept me sane till I could finally be here today and be a part of AA."

At the end of our meeting, one of the facilitators gave me several copies of Grapevine and some Step worksheets for all Twelve Steps. She said that since I had been reading the same AA literature for three years, I must be eager for some new material. I went back to my unit and got right to work reading.

I thank my Higher Power for helping me find that Big Book and for giving me an AA family in here and an actual program to work. No matter how tough things can get here in prison, I'm able to get through it and look forward to tomorrow—because of AA.

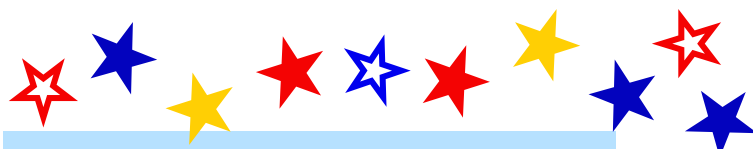

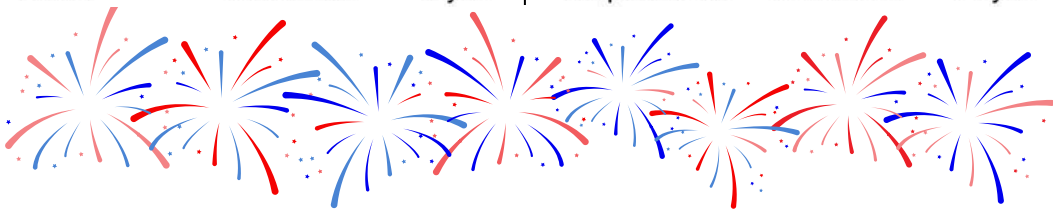

Why Staying at Our Host Hotel is Important

A Message from the Area 51 Chairperson

Typically, Area 51 host hotels charge meeting room fees based on the number of guest rooms our attendees occupy. For every Assembly, Committee Meeting and Convention, Area 51 has a contract that specifies the number of guest rooms the hotel will “block” for our use. If we fill at least 90% of our room block, our meeting space is contracted at a reduced rate.

Free meeting space is what Area 51 budgets and what we usually achieve. However, more than once we have come up short and paid a steep price. Our room block is measured in room nights; a room night is one night’s stay in one room. For example, 31 rooms booked for 2 nights each would yield 62 room nights. Given the potential costs to the Area, reservations at the host hotel are extremely important.

During the Site Investigation process, Area 51 makes every effort to negotiate the most favorable room rates possible. Budget hotels don’t have the kind of meeting space we require, and space in higher-end hotels is expensive. But the continued willingness of individuals to attend Area events and booking their rooms at our host hotel is essential in making Area events affordable at all.

So please attend the Area events that you can and stay at the host hotel using the group name. Please consider the slight extra cost as a contribution to Area 51—a small sacrifice for our “common welfare,” which really must come first if we are to continue meeting and working together to fulfill our Primary Purpose as an Area.
